

## Ed Reynolds – Biography

**Ed Reynolds** has served as Chief of Police of the University of North Texas (UNT) Police Department since November 2016. He oversees three divisions and 65 full-time employees on the university campus that serves 38,000 students and 4,000 faculty and staff members.

Chief Reynolds began his law enforcement career with UNT in 1994. He has also served the department as a police officer, corporal, sergeant, lieutenant and deputy chief. He has supervised every division within the department including operations, investigations, and administration. He led the department's successful effort to become nationally accredited in 2006 by The Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies and the International Association of Campus Law Enforcement Administrators, a distinction that fewer than 7% of law enforcement agencies nationwide achieve.

Chief Reynolds holds a master peace officer, firearms, and instructor license issued by the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement.

He earned an associate degree in criminal justice from North Central Texas College and graduated cum laude with a bachelor's degree in criminal justice from UNT. He attended the UNT police academy and graduated as valedictorian.
